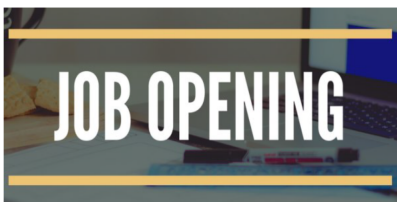

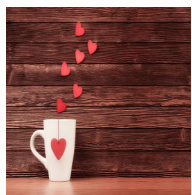
SEASONS OF HOPE GRIEF SUPPORT GROUP 11:30 TO 12:45 HELD IN THE PARISH OFFICE February 23

Did you know??

Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids permitted).

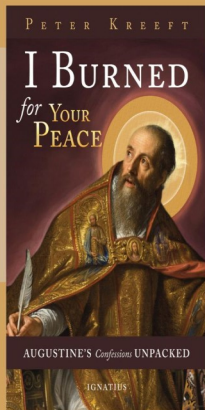

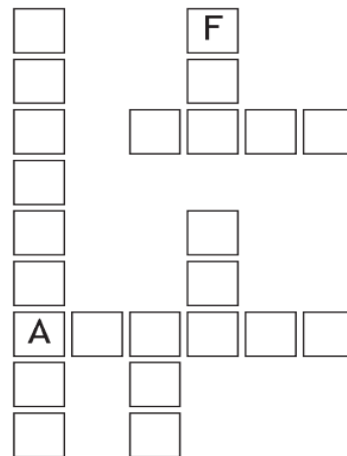
